In the News: Health Tourism Charges come into force in England



In a move to increase financing for the NHS, patients will now be checked whether they are eligible for free healthcare and will be charged up front if they are not. This includes checking whether they have lived abroad in the last 6 months and if so, requiring documentation to show their entitlement to free healthcare. Opponents to these measures say that they may prevent vulnerable populations from getting the care they need. See <u>here</u>.
